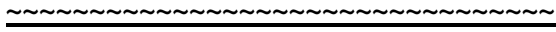

**BEATIFICATION OF REV. STANLEY ROTHER-
FIRST AMERICAN-BORN MARTYR**

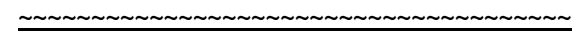
Saturday, September 23rd at 11am

This coming Saturday, Fr. Stanley Rother will be beatified at a Mass celebrated in Oklahoma City. He will now be known as Blessed Stanley Rother. He was a priest for the Oklahoma City Archdiocese. Blessed Stanley grew up on a farm in rural Oklahoma, he had some difficulties with the academics in the seminary. In 1968 he chose to travel to Guatemala to minister in the missions there. Once, he went to Guatemala he learned both Spanish and the local tribal language. He would broadcast teaching lessons on the radio and used his farming heritage to teach the locals how to plow their fields. Blessed Stanley was beloved in the missions.

During the 13 years of his ministry, the political climate in Guatemala grew very dangerous. There was a civil war in Guatemala for many years. Blessed Stanley knew priests and catechists that had been kidnapped and killed. He eventually found himself on the “death list” He went home to Oklahoma in 1980 for a visit and to pray on his role in the missions. After much prayer Blessed Stanley was quoted “I know what I must do. A shepherd needs his people. As priests we are not ordained for ourselves. We are called to be servants of God’s people.”

Fr. Stanley went back to missions and on the early hours of July 21, 1981 he was shot and killed. His body lies in Oklahoma but his heart is enshrined in the Church of Santiago Atitlan, Guatemala.

You can watch a documentary on Blessed Stanley on EWTN on Monday September 18th at 1pm or Friday, September 22nd at 8pm. The Beatification Mass will be televised on EWTN at 11am. This is the second beatification Mass to be held in the United States.

Casserole size = half steamer pan (10.5” x 8.13”), please label with contents, date made & date frozen
Content labeling example = mac & cheese with ham, meatless chili, tuna with rice & peas, etc.

Casserole ideas = Mac & cheese plain, tuna, ham, vegetables. Chili meatless, beef, turkey.

Tuna with pasta & peas, rice & mixed vegs in white sauce or creamy soup.

Leftovers hamburger/chicken/etc. combined with vegs in a creamy soup sauce.

Ground beef with mashed potatoes and mixed vegetables.

Pasta with meatballs or sausage in tomato sauce with cheese.



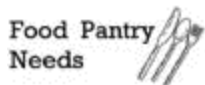

Happy Birthday, St. Cecilia School

Fr. Kavanagh was elevated to the rank of Monsignor in October, 1959. Monsignor Kavanagh then retired in January, 1971. The Saint Cecilia School/Parish Hall was renamed to the Monsignor Raymond Kavanagh Hall on February 17, 1979, on the first year anniversary of his death. So that his memory might be kept in the hearts of the people of St. Cecilia Parish a painting of Monsignor Raymond Kavanagh was donated and is still present today.
