I was impressed and even humbled with how Mark walked with only 3 items in his back pack each day. The rest of us had our back packs filled many "things" just in case we needed it.

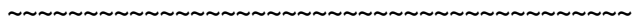

The Little Angels parents have been incredibly generous in trying to get this massive project underway. The Knights of Columbus generously put hard labor into removing the old dangerous playground equipment. Through our parent’s fundraising efforts, we were able to purchase tricycles and other new playground toys. But despite the hard work, we were at a standstill. But starting this week, the ground will officially be breaking on a brand new playground entirely funded by the P.J. W. Restaurant Group. Headquartered in Westmont, NJ. The P.J. W. Restaurant Group was founded in 1983 by Bob and Donna Platzer.

Bob Platzer, a Pennsauken native and St. Cecilia’s School graduate, this union was a perfect fit.

Construction on the playground will run through July with an announcement regarding an opening celebration forthcoming.
