FEAST OF OUR LADY OF ALTAGRACIA

The Feast of Our Lady of Altagracia – “Virgin of the Highest Grace” dates back to when Spain first canonized the Island of Hispaniola (Haiti & Dominican Republic) 2 brothers brought a painting of the Virgin to Hispaniola from Spain in 1502.

The painting of the patron Saint of Dominican Republic shows the scene of the birth of Jesus. Legend states that the image of the virgin mysteriously disappeared from the house of the 2 brothers. The painting later appeared in an orange bush. The location of this bush is where the first church of Higüey was built. Now thousands devoted visitors make the trip here to ask for favors of Mary.

All are welcome to attend on Saturday, January 19th at 6:30pm in the Church and the celebration after Mass.

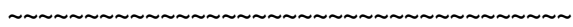
LOAVES & FISHES FOOD PANTRY

Pledges: \$485,300 ((131%))

Our parish has reached the goal of \$370,000 and more! Through the generosity of 121 families from the Major Gift Phase and the Commitment Weekends, our parishioners have pledged \$476,000. That is 129% of our goal!

The parishioners at all the Masses were very supportive with their pledges. The pledges were for 3-5 years. I was humbled at the “sacrifice” many people were willing to make to help our parish.
