St. Pope John Paul II established Divine Mercy Sunday (Second Sunday of Easter) in April, 2000. It is based on the private revelations of St. Faustina Kowalska, which recommended a particular devotion to the Divine Mercy. St. Faustina lived in Poland and described an image of Jesus, with rays of blue and red coming

At the Canonization ceremony of St. Faustina in April, 2000, St. John Paul II stated "the consoling message of the Divine Mercy is addressed above all to, those who affected by a particular harsh trial or crushed by the weight of the sins they committed have lost confidence in life and are trapped to give in to despair. To them the gentle face of Christ is offered in those rays from his heart that touched them and warm them and fill them with hope. Image how many souls have been consoled by the prayer "Jesus, I trust in you."

St. Faustina gave the Church these following words to say for the Divine Mercy Chaplet. "For the sake of his sorrowful passion, have mercy on us and the whole world.

JUBILEE YEAR OF HOPE CANONIZATION OF BLESSED CARLOS ACUTIS April 27th

The Church will celebrate the Jubilee of Teenagers in Rome on April 27th. To mark this Jubilee the Canonization of Carlo Acutis will take place on Sunday, April 27th at 10:30am. (Rome Time)

Carlo Acutis was born near Milan in 1991. He was a computer-coding teenager who died of cancer in 2006. He is known for his great devotion to the real presence of Jesus in the Eucharist. Shortly after his First Communion, at the age 7, Carlo told his mother "To always be united to Jesus. This is my plan."

He called the Eucharist "my highway to heaven" and he did all in his power to make the presence known. His witness inspired his own parents to return to practicing the Catholic faith. Over the course of two and a half years, he worked with his parents on an exhibition about Eucharistic Miracles that premiered in 2005.

This presentation has gone onto be presented in diocese throughout the world.

Carlo died at 15 years old and beautified in 2020. Thousands of pilgrims have gone to Assisi to pray at his grave.

The Diocese of Camden has recently renovated the Convent at Camden Catholic High School to hold retreats.

It will be called the St. Carlo Acutis Retreat Center.

In 2023, the House of Charity – Bishop's Appeal was changed to the South Jersey Catholic Ministries Appeal.
