DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY

The Church will celebrate Divine Mercy Sunday, April 7, 2024.

St. Pope John Paul II established Divine Mercy Sunday (Second Sunday of Easter) in 2000. It is based on the private revelations of St. Faustina Kowalska, which recommended a particular devotion to the Divine Mercy. St. Pope John Paul stated “It is important that we accept the whole message that comes to us from the world of God on this Second Sunday of Easter. In the various readings, the liturgy seems to indicate the path of mercy, while-reestablishing the relationship of each person with God, also created new relations of fraternal solidarity among human beings”.

(Homily, April 30, 2000)

St. Faustina gave the Church these following words to say for the Divine Mercy Chaplet. “For the sake of his sorrowful passion have mercy on us and the whole world”.
