SOLEMNITY OF STS. PETER & PAUL

June 29th

In the Plaza of San Pietro in Rome, the statues of Sts. Peter and Paul flank the square, symbolizing the complimentary nature of these saint's lives and mission.

Paul represents the person who comes to faith through a dramatic conversion. Peter is the person who comes to faith slowly and steady, sometimes experiencing doubt.

Peter is the apostle of the Jewish Christians, while Paul is the apostle to gentile Christians. God calls each of us in different ways. We don't get to judge how a person is called or to what God is call them.

Sts. Peter and Paul were called at different times they are even called by different incarnations of Christ.

Their work and responses were different but each does profound and import work.

Throughout centuries of history, Catholics have supported the Church's mission of evangelization and charity by giving to the annual Peter's Pence collection. # <u>SOUTH JERSEY</u> CATHOLIC MINISTRIES

In the past the Diocese of Camden had set every parish's goal at 15-20% of the parish's Ordinary income.

The past couple of years, our parish's goal was set at 19.7%. In 2024, the parish goal was 50,600.00 and through the generosity of <u>90</u> families 52,504.00 was raised.

Parishes received 10% of the goal when pledges were paid in full and 75% of all pledges over goal.

Our parish received a check of \$5,060.00 in early January 2025, and for \$3,200.00 in May.

This year Bishop Sullivan, before his retirement decided to set every parish's goal at 17.7% of ordinary income in honor of the Jubilee, and will received 10% of the goal and 100% of pledges over the goal.

For 2025, our parish's goal is \$45,000. As of <u>June 17<sup>th</sup></u> we have surpassed our goal with \$52,498.00 from <u>65</u> families.

Remember that our parish will receive 10% of goal (\$4,560.00) and 100% of all pledges paid over the goal.

I thank all of the families that have participated in this year's South Jersey Catholic Ministries Appeal.

I ask parishioners to consider a pledge or an outright gift in the next 2 weeks.

#### June 24<sup>th</sup>:

The Nativity of St. John the Baptist Some families spend months poring over names as they detrmine what a baby will be called. Other families know that the child will be given a family name.

The parents of John the Baptist, Zachariah and Elizabeth, left the choosing of the name to God. When the angels told the couple that Elizabeth would give birth, he gave them the name John, which means "the Lord has shown favor". The Church celebrates John's birth because he pointed the Way to Jesus.



June 27<sup>th</sup>: St. Cyril of Alexandria – Bishop St. Cyril was the patriarch of Alexandria from 412-444. He promoted recognition of Mary, as the Mother of God. He made major contributions to the understanding of the two natures of Jesus Christ. St. Cyril offered strong leadership and rigorous thought to the Church a formative period in her history.



## July 3<sup>rd</sup>: St. Thomas, Apostle

St. Thomas died in the 1<sup>st</sup> century. St. Thomas is absent when the risen Christ appears to the Apostles.

He does not believe their account of seeing the Lord, thus earning the nickname "Doubting Thomas".

St. Thomas is associated with founding the Church in India. He is the patron of builders, India and Pakistan.
