## **SOUTH JERSEY CATHOLIC MINISTRIES 2024**

Began in 1964, the House of Charity has been an annual fundraiser supporting the ministries of the Diocese of Camden to meet the various needs through South Jersey.

In 2023, the House of Charity – Bishop's Appeal was changed to South Jersey Catholic Ministries Appeal. The change was made to better describe the variety of causes and ministries supported by the Annual Appeal and emphasize the importance of our regional community.

The Appeal supports:

Vocations – the education and benefits of our 9 seminarians.

Hospital Chaplains – providing chaplains (Priests/Deacons) in the many hospital/medical centers in the six counties of our Diocese.

Our parish goal for 2023 was \$50,600.00 and through the generosity of 95 families, \$52,735.00 was raised. The parish receives 10% of the goal when pledges are paid in full. Our parish will receive a check for \$5,060.00.

## **FAITHFULL FOOD DRIVE**

**March 17<sup>th</sup>**

Here in South Jersey, 1 in 6 people suffer from food insecurity, which means, they are not sure where their next meal is coming from. In response, the Diocese of Camden is organizing the 11<sup>th</sup> Faithfull Food Drive on Sunday, March 17<sup>th</sup>.

Every parish in our diocese will collect food for local pantries and the Food Bank of South Jersey.

Our parish's food pantry "Loaves and Fishes" receives a lot of food from the Food Bank each month.

- Loaves and Fishes Pantry is open every Saturday from 10:00-11:00am. People can receive assistance 2 times a month. The number of people coming to the Food Pantry has really increased over the past 6 months. Our pantry assists over 250 families a month.
- Our parishioners have been very supportive to the pantry every year, (bring food to the Church or Rectory) every month.

All the food collected here at Mary, Queen of All Saints, will stay at the Loaves and Fishes Pantry. We will send a report to the Diocese of how much food (pounds) were collected here.

Beans, Pasta, Soup, Canned Vegetables.**

**You can bring the food donations to the Church on Sunday, March 17<sup>th</sup> until 2:00pm, and to the Rectory on Monday, November 18<sup>th</sup> until 6:00pm.**
